

Kelly's Directory 1855

SEDGEHILL is a township and parish situated 20 miles south west of Salisbury and 3 north of Shaftesbury in the Hundred of Dunworth, Mere Union, Hindon Division, Salisbury Bishopric, South Wilts; it contains 179 inhabitants and 1,171 acres of corn and pasture land.

The church, excepting the tower, was rebuilt in 1844; the latter stands at the west end of the church and contains 3 bells.

The living is a rectory, incorporated with Berwick St. Leonard, valued at £374, in the patronage of the Marquis of Westminster.

The Rev Charles Henry Grove, M.A., is the present incumbent.

The Rev Henry Sweeting, M.A., is Curate.

There is a parochial school supported by the Rector.

West Hayes is the residence of Mrs. George Grove.

Whitemarsh, Keepend, White Bridge, Stocklane and Haggler's Hole are other places.
