The 8th (Service) Battalion was formed in Preston in September 1914 as part of K3 and came under command of 74th Brigade in 25th Division. They moved to Codford Wiltshire (training camp) and in billets in Bournemouth in November 1914.

Thomas Kivell was buried at Bonham (St. Benedict) Catholic Chapelyard in Stourton Wiltshire on 5th November 1915.

By 1958, Bonham Chapel had closed and the building and burial ground was sold into private ownership. As a result, CWGC could no longer maintain Thomas's grave, so his body was exhumed and re-buried at Wardour, the nearest Catholic cemetery to Stourton. Other than his re-burial, Thomas had no connection with Wardour or Tisbury.
